

This is a counterfeit Mills War Eagle. There are many reasons why. Below are just a few of them.

Exterior: the handle is incorrect for the era. It should have a "bend" in it to allow clearance during play. it pays off on a single cherry. The War Eagle only pays off on two cherries. there is no normal/natural wear to the coin entry. the machine appears brand new. the wood base should have two nails in it. Two "tacks" are inserted to give authenticity. the sides are not Formica. the base appears brand new.

Interior (not shown): the entire mechanism is new looking. Only a few parts appear to be original. there is no check detector lever (horizontal). there is no check detector lever assembly (vertical). there is no paper inside showing date and inspector number. the clock fan is made of stainless steel (it should be brass to allow for temperature changes.) the door is made of thin-gauge metal.
