There are several stages of operation for your mechanical machine.

- 1. Coining
- 2. Wind-up Cycle
- 3. Release
- 4. Unwind Cycle
- 5. Indexing
- 6. Payout

Listen for five (5) clicks or noises EVENLY SPACED time-wise:

- 1. Reel Number 1 (left reel) comes to a stop.
- 2. Reel Number 2 (center reel) comes to a stop.
- 3. Reel Number 3 (right reel) comes to a stop.
- 4. Vertical payout pushback lever releases the vertical payout levers.
 - 5. Payout slides reset.

If any one of these audible motions DOES NOT occur, the machine is jammed. A coin (especially a small, thin coin like a dime) can be wedged in: the clock fan, escalator, payout slides, payout tube, other levers, other coins.

If you decide to remove the jam, follow these directions:

- a. Open the back of the slot machine.
- b. Remove the bonnet.
- c. Lift the friction tabs and undo the bolt (if a bolt is present) holding the mechanism to the casing.
- d. Slide the mechanism out of the casing and place it on an old towel (to absorb grease, oils, etc.)
- e. Examine each section where the jam may have occurred (as we showed you during our repair visit to you.)

Recommendations

- 1. If power is required to operate the lights/bell, keep the machine UNplugged until it is ready to be used. (Plug-in models only.)
- 2. Plug the machine into a grounded 3-prong outlet. (Plug-in models only.)
- 3. Play ONLY one coin. Play the correct denomination coin. Do NOT add additional coins. Mechanical slot machines rarely play more than one coin.
- 4. Wait for the coin to drop through the coin entrance to rest against the sensing pin.
- 5. Pull the handle down completely. Let it return under its own force.
- 6. The machine should start its windup mode.
- 7. During the unwind mode all three reels should audibly/visually index.
- 8. Wait for any payout of coins. Do not shake or hit the slot machine.
- 9. DO NOT force the machine's handle if it jams.
- 10. DO NOT use any "water displacement" type sprays in or on your slot machine.
- 11. Use petroleum jelly on the main operating fork instead of grease.
- 12. Use a light sewing machine oil on any metal/metal surfaces.
- 13. DO NOT lubricate the slides with any lubricant (liquid, powder, oils, etc.)
- 14. DO NOT adjust springs, screws, bolts, nuts, gears or levers.
- 15. DO NOT attempt to adjust the odds or payouts. These are fixed.
- 16. DO NOT lose the key to the front jackpot panel (if there is one).
- 17. DO NOT lose your temper.

Other:

- 18. DO NOT open the machine to "tinker" with it. There is nothing to adjust.
- 19. DO NOT lose the rear cabinet keys. Some types of keys are nearly impossible to reproduce. Some of the locks are very difficult to enter and pick open. (I know, I have tried. Thomas Baker)
