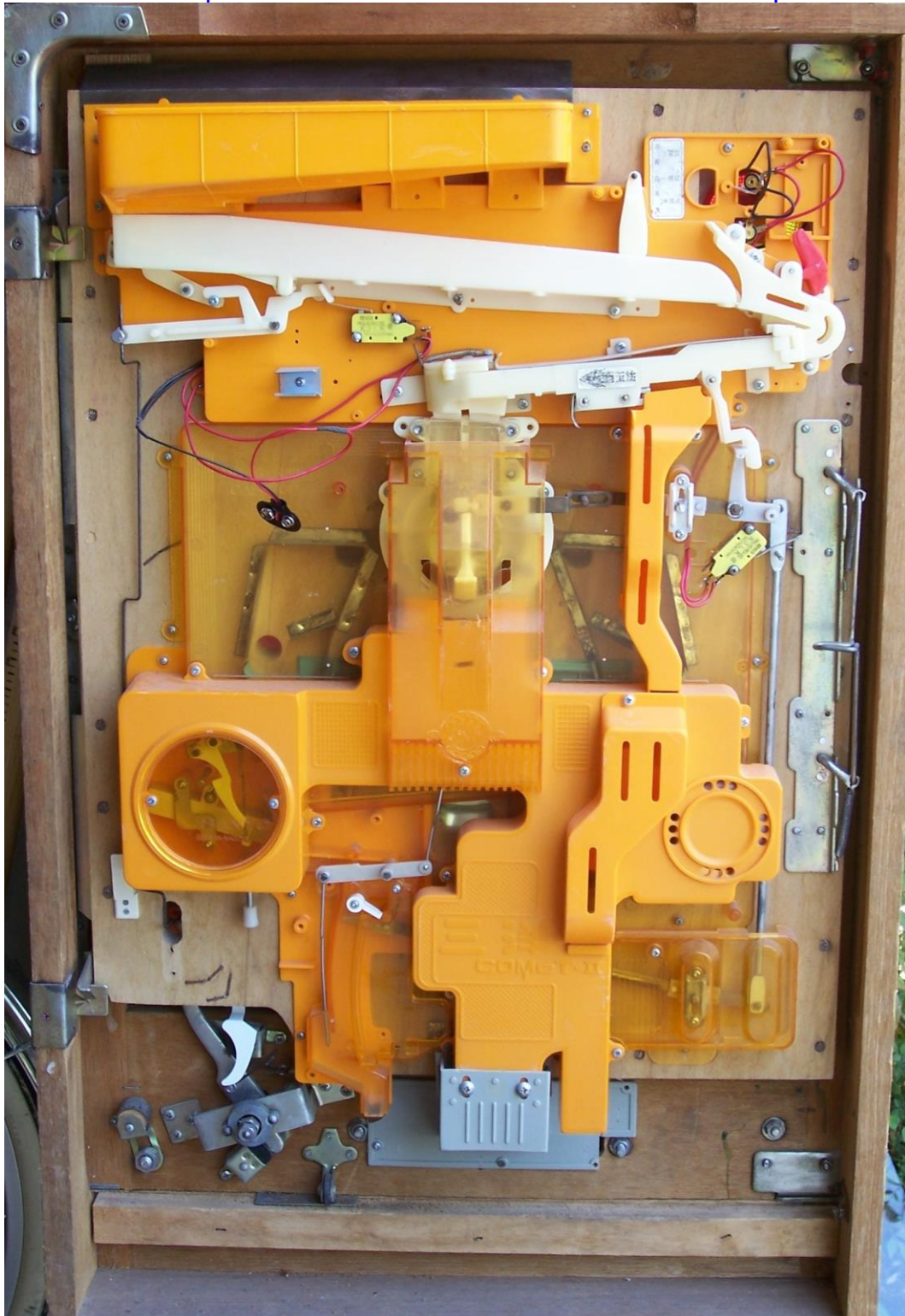

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The following photos are for the Pachinko game currently under restoration. Your machine may (or may not) be like this one. They all work on the same principle, however. They are noisy, gravity-driven machines that need cleaning, lubrication (silicone spray) and proper wall-mounting and storage.

DO NOT store your Pachinko game outside or in the garage. It will invariably rust, as this one evidently shows. DO NOT use "water displacement" sprays on, in, or near, the mechanism/levers. Do not use oil or grease.

Do not use ball bearings other than 7/16 inch or 11 mm in diameter. However, the 7/16 inch diameter bearings may get stuck in the reward pockets or between the metal pegs. Just bend the pegs wider very slightly.

Pachinko play balls also rust! Keep them clean and dry. DO NOT oil them or use any silicone spray on them. DO NOT smoke around your machine. Keep all liquids away from both the back and front cabinet and contents. Please do not let anyone tamper with the levers, springs, counterweights or award assemblies. There are no user-serviceable parts in your Pachinko game. Gently clean both sides of the glass with a soft cloth and a mild-chemical window spray.

Do not abuse your game or become frustrated with it. Call or email us if you have any questions. Photos would help us to diagnose any problems.

Be gentle with your Pachinko game; it is many decades old!

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Ball Recovery Assembly



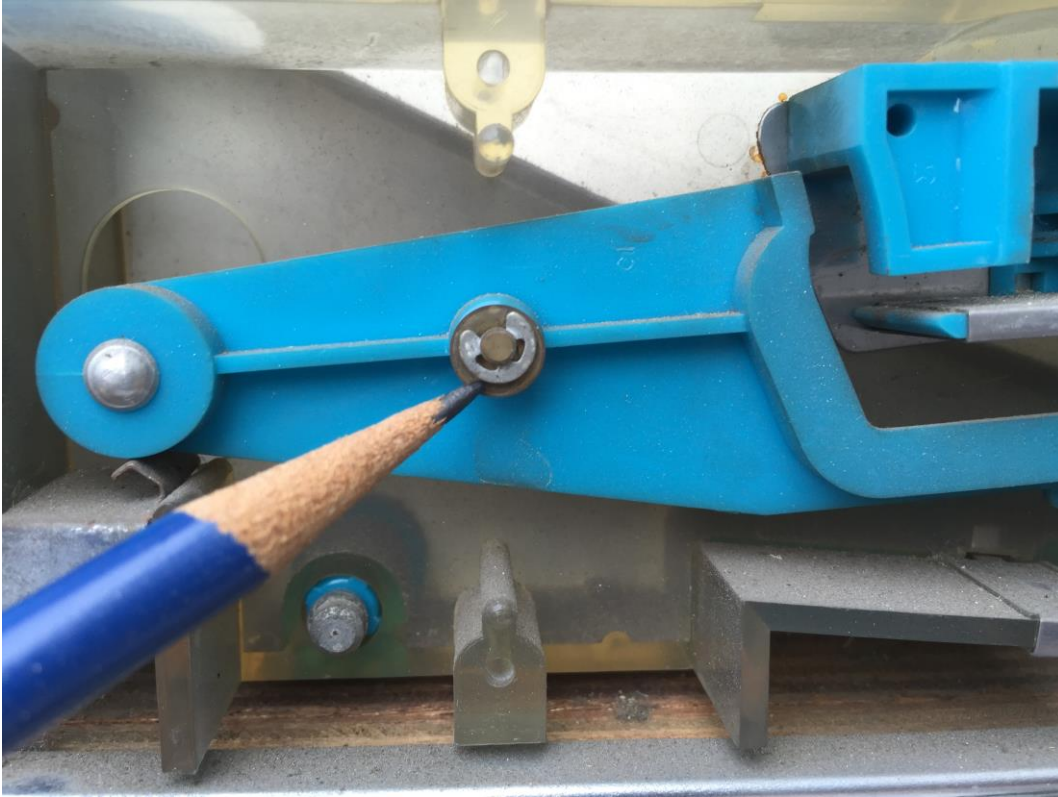
Latch Release Assembly - (on front of game below main glass door; push lever down to release the ball recovery assembly just below this latch)



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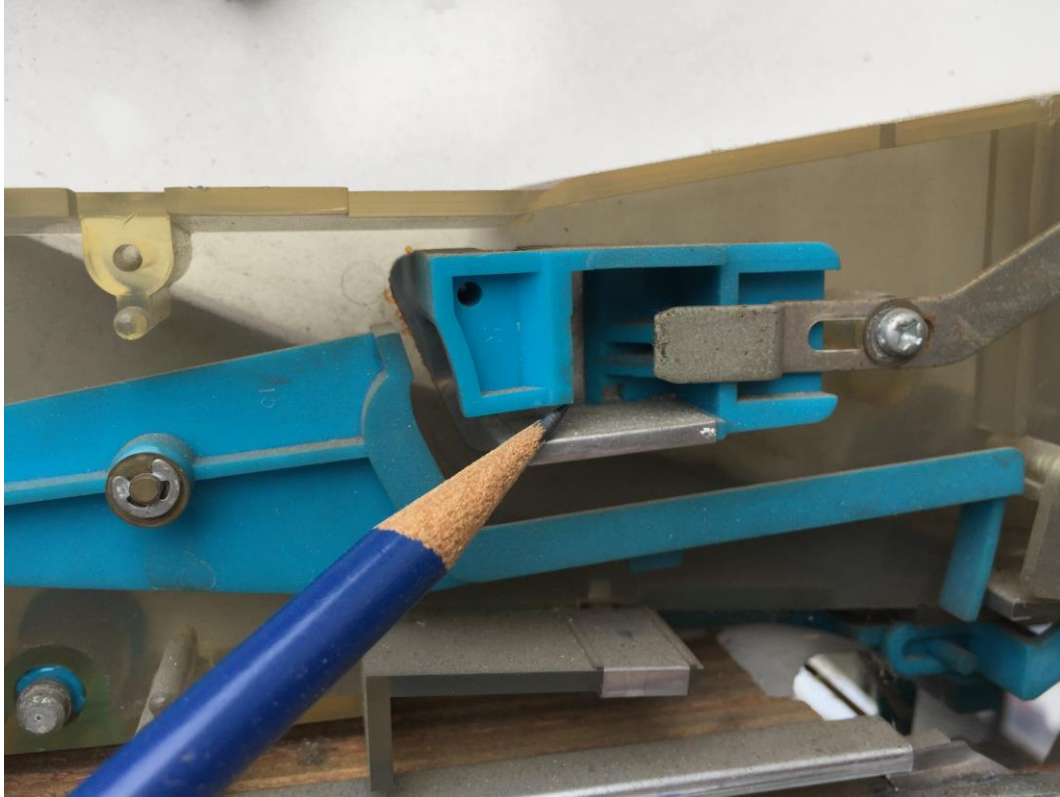


"E-clip" - (on any metal/plastic or metal/metal hinges, pivots, etc., place a drop or two of silicone spray on these joints; DO NOT overspray!)

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Pachinko Ball Entrance - (a ball exits from here to roll downward into the blue pathway below and then into the next slot where it will be launched by a spring-actuated mallet - KEEP this area clean and smooth! The silver tab to the right of the pencil tip pushes forward when there are no more ball bearings in the back inside the large upper tray; it will stop all ball action until more Pachinko balls are added)



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Metal Pivot - (since every Pachinko game is different, use this only as a guide; keep this area clean and place a drop or two of silicone spray on the joint)

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E-clip and Counterweight - (use silicone spray here)

Ball Entry Holding Area- (this shield prevents the ball from falling out of its intended path; keep this and the blue plastic path clean and smooth; the ball bearing enters into this chamber in preparation to be launched by the spring-loaded mallet in back)



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Handle - (use silicone spray in the groove; sparingly!)





Pivot - (allows blue lever to slide; keep clean and lubricated with silicone)



Reward Pockets - (these open and close when a ball enters;  
keep clean, lubricate the hinges)





Main Reward Pocket - (the motif or subject design for each game is usually in the center of the playing field)





Ball Entrance - (just below the main reward pocket; a ball enters, slows down due to the "fins" at the exit and then it enters the next reward pocket)



Spinner - (these rotate quickly when a ball strikes the mechanism;  
keep clean and lubricated)
